Congratulations! The Admissions Committee has recommended you for an appointment to the United States Military Academy (USMA). Accordingly, I have reserved a cadetship for you contingent upon , candidate fitness qualification, continued excellent work in school, and file completion. You must send the Admissions Office your updated Candidate Fitness Assessment (CFA) results and the Candidate Statement by December 15, 2005 or this letter of assurance will be withdrawn. When these matters are resolved, you will be appointed a member of the USMA Class of 2010.

If you have not visited the Military Academy, I invite you to join the Corps of Cadets for an overnight orientation visit. Scheduled Monday through Friday during the academic term (September 12th through November 17th and January 10th through April 28th), the program begins at 9:00 a.m. and concludes at approximately 12:30 p.m. the following day. During the visit, candidates accompany cadet escorts to class and other activities, spend one night in the barracks and eat meals with their escorts in the Cadet Mess. Families and friends participate in a group orientation and a walking tour of the academic area.
