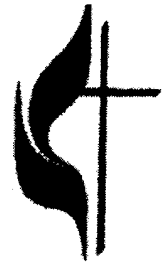
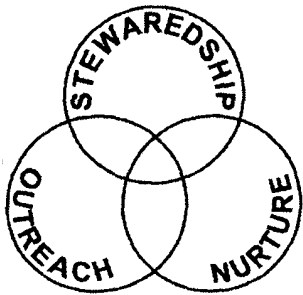

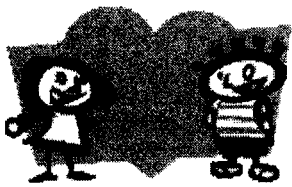

Be the missionary that your baptism calls you to be, and invite someone to come to church with you. Be deliberate in enacting your faith, so others can see in you the love of Christ and the servant that God calls us all to be. "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." 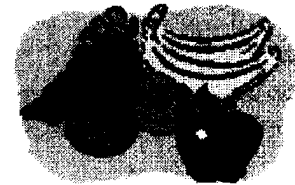

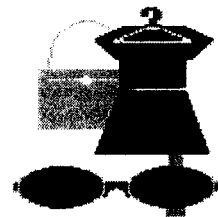

THRIFT SHOP

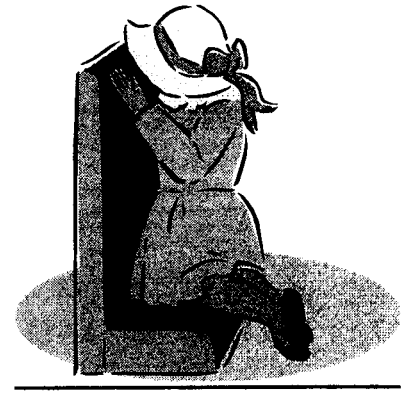

TRUSTEES REPORT

The Trustees would like to thank you for your support in acquiring a new sign and assisting in paying to update the lighting in the church. We are almost at the end of the road with both projects. With help from the Thrift Shop we have placed an order for the sign that has been displayed for the past month in the worship service. However we still need your support with 24 more lights to complete the lighting project. We will need \$1600.00 for the additional lights.

This past month we have assisted a new church with a large number of children's chairs and tables we have been storing in our attic and have no need of. Some of these items we have stored in our classrooms for a number of years.

The Trustees are asking for your help in preventing accumulating furniture and other items, which has not been approved by the Trustees to be on church property. In the future, we are asking that a letter be addressed to the Trustees for approval before any items are brought into the church for hallways and classrooms. Examples: (furniture, computers, tables, chairs, household items, and televisions). Items not approved by the Trustees have become a problem and create a hazard by cluttering our halls and classrooms.

We are also asking items not be removed from existing classrooms and placed in hallways. This creates a "*cluttered look*" and can be a hazard for hall traffic, especially our children.

All of our workers are volunteers and their payment is seeing our customers with affordable bargains and knowing the money made goes into our church and for community outreach.

This past year God has blessed us by sending lots of merchandise. We really appreciate you supporting us with donations but we need your help! We need you to volunteer.

I would like to invite those of you who have not worked in the Thrift Shop to come join us. Join us in making a difference in the lives of others and enjoy fellowship with coworkers. Our hours of operation are Monday to Thursday 10:00 to 2:00 Friday 10:00 to 4:00, Sat.10:00 to 2:00. Monday is our workday and we work till the work is done! You are able to see the fruits of labor from the Thrift Shop as you look at the future sign; our lighting in the church, new chairs in the Pastors office and the new TV Pastor Marc uses in our Disciple Bible Study. The Thrift Shop supports the work of many community agencies: such as Better Health, The Care Center, Salvation Army, Social Services just to name a few. We also help support day camp, youth programs Easter egg hunt and at present, the mailing of our Shoe Boxes... Come Join Us and serve St. Matthews and the community.

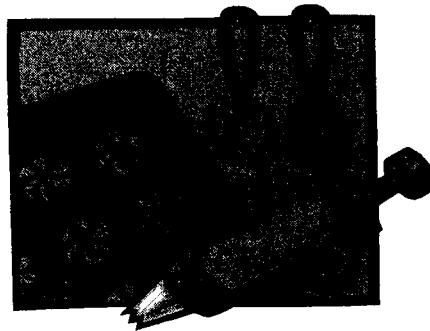

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Roasted Pumpkin Squash Soup

(created by Executive Chef at the White House, Cristeta Comerford)

- 1 ½ lbs of pumpkin
- 1 Vidalia Onion
- 1 cup carrots, peeled and diced
- 1 cup celery, diced
- 1T olive oil
- 6 cloves garlic
- 2 bay leaves
- 1T peppercorn
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 sprig thyme
- 4 cups chicken stock
- 2 sticks cinnamon
- 1 ½ tsp. esepette powder or paprika
- 1 cup low fat yogurt

Pumpkin oil

Preheat Oven to 350 degrees. Cut the pumpkin in half and place it, cut side down, on an oiled baking sheet. Bake until it is easily pierced with a knife(45 min). Let cool. Scoop the flesh and discard the skin and seeds. Press the pumpkin flesh through a strainer. Warm the olive oil in a soup pot over medium hear. Sweat the carrots, onion, garlic until translucent for about 5-10 minutes. Add the dry spices and the aromatics. Add the pumpkin puree and chicken stock. Bring to a boil and simmer 15 minutes. Add entire mixture to blender, blend. Season. Put back into a pot and simmer gently. Garnish with candied pepitas. **To make candied pepitas:** Toast 1/2 cup pepitas (pumpkin seeds) in a preheated nonstick pan. Add enough powdered sugar to coat the pepitas. Add salt and esepette powder. Stir until sugar dissolves-pumpkin seeds will pop. Remove from pan and cool.
