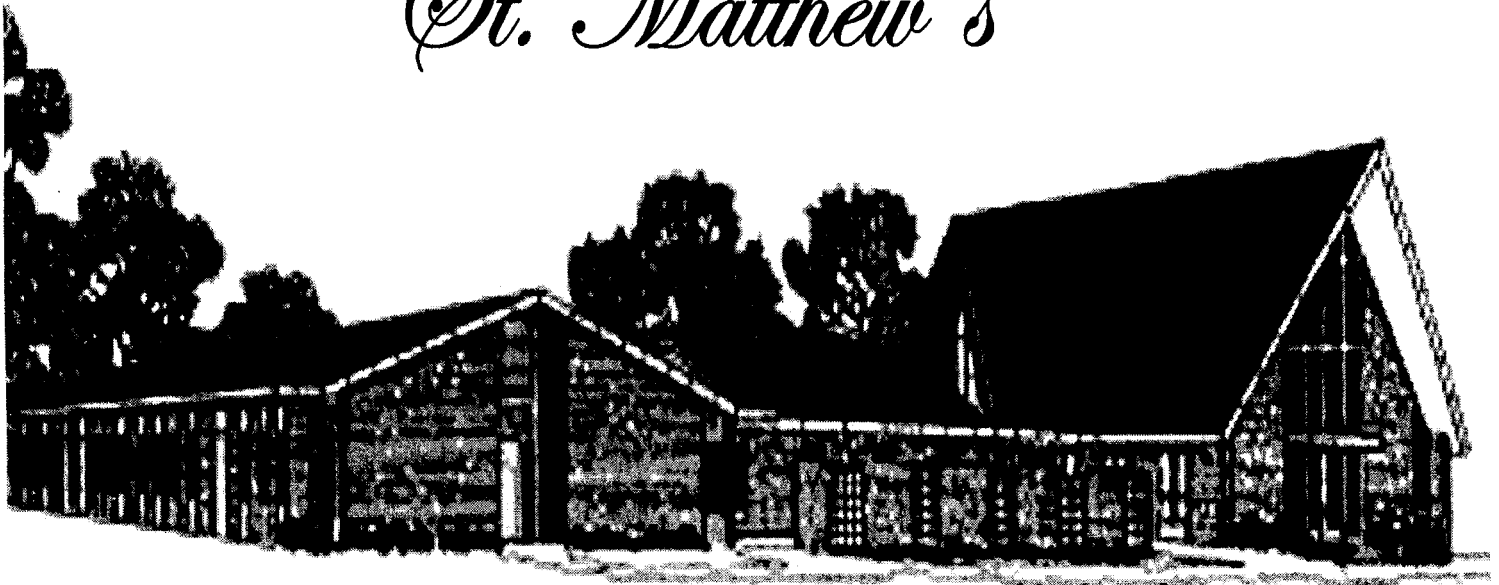


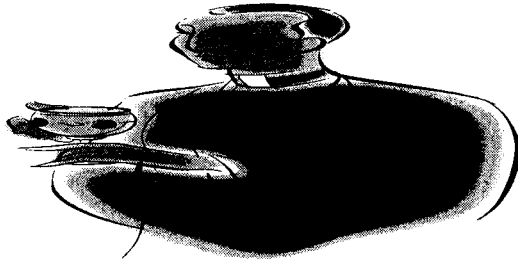

This month, October, brings us toward the end of the calendar year and toward the beginning of the Christian year. Traditionally, this time of year also brings us to the awareness that we are to be good stewards. In our pledge as we joined the United Methodist Church, we affirmed our intent to support its ministries by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, and your service. This is the time of year we traditionally renew that vow.

The dictionary tells us that a steward is “a person who manages another's property or financial affairs; one who administers anything as the agent of another or others.” That’s what we are, people who manage God’s property. That is a full time job that includes being respectful of natural resources, keeping our neighborhoods clean, our church building in good repair, returning borrowed items to where we found them, pitching in on “cleanup” days, and local and world-wide mission work.

In October each year, we go about reminding our congregations of the need for money to support the church’s ability to serve others. The number of programs we support, and the involvement of our congregation has grown significantly over the past year. Lots of activities for Christians are going on and lots of things to reach the non-churched are in progress. People are reaching out and reaching up, and God is reaching down to help us serve others. It is exciting to be involved with such an active, giving, and alive congregation!

My goal for St. Matthews is to move closer to being a congregation that tithes. Can you imagine what God could do through this church if we were biblical in our returning thanks to God and returning a portion of what he has given us? Wow! I get goose bumps just thinking about it.

I think of stewardship more as a spiritual, rather than a financial issue. As you consider your commitment to your church, I pray that you will make a commitment to yourself to move your personal spiritual index higher. What percent of your income is presently going to support your church? If it is not 10%, make a commitment to yourself to increase that by 5% this year and then the rest of the way, to get to a biblical tithe, next year.

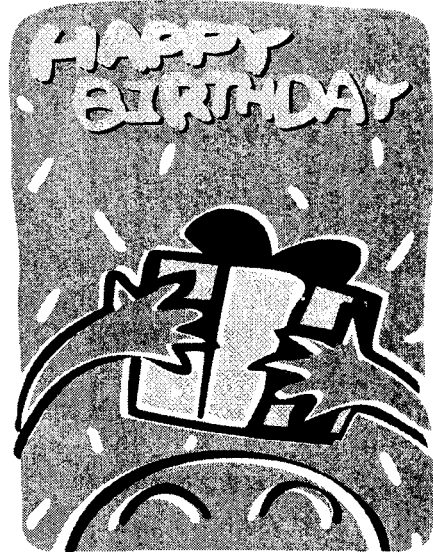

Know God’s love and know the special joy that comes from sharing that love with others.

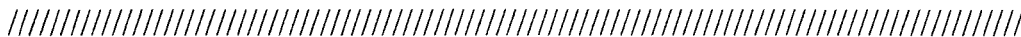

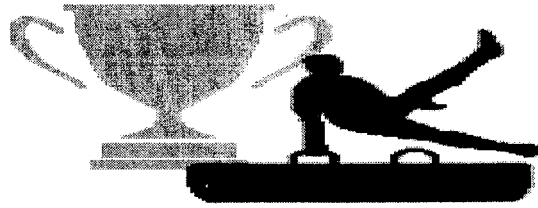

**Praise Team update:**

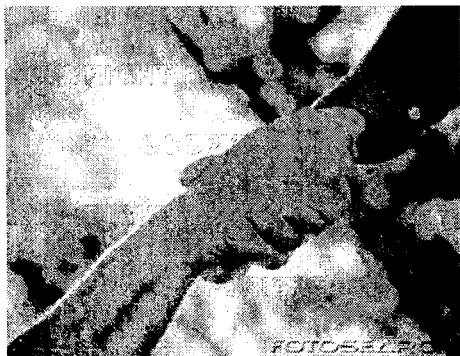

If tears could build a stairway

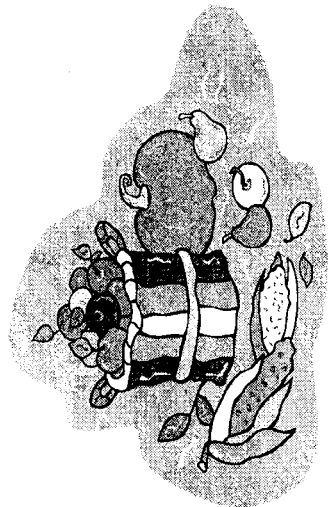
And memories were a lane
