Shortly after arriving as pastor of the St. Matthews/ Grace Charge in February 2001, **I found a number of the people in both churches dissatisfied with the charge arrangement and how it came about.** Many of the leaders at St. Matthew's publicly and privately expressed a desire for the church to be a station appointment again. I shared that if this were the wish of the majority I would make an effort to accomplish this goal within a couple of years.

As you know, I have been working for over two years to help Grace UMC find a part time local pastor appointed to them. Our DS offered Grace the option to use Henry Hunt as a Parish Assistant under my supervision and have him take over most of the roles of a local pastor at Grace. The people at Grace voted to accept this alternative. I offered to significantly reduce my salary to help them financially, which freed me up to be at St. Matthew's most of the time.

This move on my part was an act of faith. I had faith that this was in the best interest of both churches. The plan is for Grace to become a part time church appointment in July 2004 following Annual Conference. As we approach charge conference, **I hope St. Matthew's will act in faith to pick up the slack in salary support to get the church back on track as a single church appointment.** I am willing to make some concession to help this process.

As a matter of fact, I am willing to go back to the same charge salary I was receiving three years ago when I came here. All I ask is an honest attempt by the church to provide a cost of living adjustment to match inflation which would be \$63,859 for salary, utilities, & travel for 2004; a \$851 increase over last years charge total. A cost of living adjustment based on inflation is what people on Social Security and military retirees usually get.

The Annual Conference suggests a salary package raise each year based on the average of raises given pastors in the Conference the preceding year. **Those average recommended raises were 6% for 2001; 4.29% for 2002; 5% for 2003 and 5.18% for 2004.** St. Matthew's raise was 4.5% in 2001; 0 in 2002 and 5% in 2003. A 5.18% raise over last year would amount to a charge total of \$66,279 for 2004: a \$3,270 increase over 2003.

I do not want or need this large of an increase. But I would not like to go backwards when Grace leaves the charge either. **How many of you could handle a 20-25% reduction in income.** For St. Matthew's to pick up the balance to become a station church again will be a substantial increase in the budget.

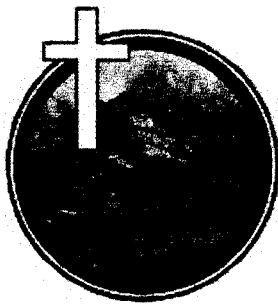
I shared with you when I first came here that I was interested in a long pastorate at St. Matthew's. For me ten years or so is not out of the question if that is a mutual desire on the part of the church. Church growth research indicates that churches with long appointments have a better chance to grow. Some research concludes that a pastor's most productive years begin at around year eight. Why? In a system like ours where pastors move so often it is difficult for a church to develop a clear vision for the future when there are so many pastoral changes and disruptions in the operation of the church.

I believe we have the potential for significant growth and have arrived at a critical point where we will either choose to go forward or backward. Some important decisions have to be made now. Lorri Shackelford suggested that PPR consider the cost of the average conference salary package for 2003 for a comparison, which was \$70,145. The new proposal of \$63,859 by Pastor Parrish is substantially lower than last year's conference average. Setting an even lower salary will assure less consideration for an appointment when seeking a new pastor in the near or distant future.

With a long-term goal of growth and outreach it is much better stewardship for our church to meet the PPR recommendation and then start investing our money in adding a part time Minister of Visitation, Youth and Children's Minister, or Outreach Minister to help expand the ministries of our church and increase the number of giving members. Then we can consider looking at or meeting the average conference salary base when we have a larger active giving base.

Not too many weeks ago an active member of this church said, "I have attended this church for 40 years, and we are in the best financial shape we have ever been in." The financial secretary's most recent report backs up the statement with data for the last ten or twelve years. I think we have made a tremendous amount of progress in terms of stewardship, nurture and outreach the past three years. **I have acted in faith on what you said you wanted; now is your opportunity to act in faith. I hope you will commit to taking another step forward in 2004.** This year's decision will have long-range consequences for St. Mathew's future.

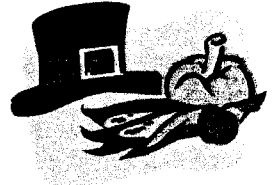

RECIPE OF THE MONTH "GRANNY'S LEMON SQUARES"

- | | |
|------------------------------|-------------------|
| 1/2 cup butter, softened | 2 eggs |
| 1/4 cup confectioners' sugar | 1 cup sugar |
| 1/2 tsp baking powder | 1/4 tsp salt |
| 1 cup all-purpose flour | 2 TBS lemon juice |



Cream butter & confectioners' sugar in a small mixing bowl. Add flour, mixing well. Press into a non-greased 9x9 inch baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. In a small mixing bowl beat together eggs, sugar, baking powder, lemon juice, and salt until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Pour over hot crust. Return to oven and continue baking 25 minutes or until no imprint remains in center when touched lightly. Cool and cut into two-inch squares.

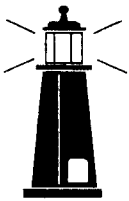

HURRICANE RELIEF:



Our Bishop, Marion Edwards, wrote the following, "Many in our North Carolina Conference are suffering from the effects of Hurricane Isabel.
