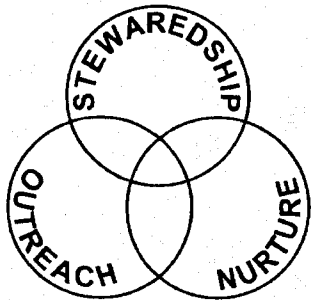

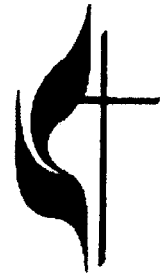

WHY MAKE NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS?

I guess that each New Year suggests to us an opportunity to begin over again. The New Year becomes a chance for a fresh start. Maybe that is the reason we feel that a New Year is a good time to make resolutions about what we ought to be doing.

The ancient Hebrews must have seen it that way. Their New Years celebration was linked with the Day of Atonement; becoming one with God again. This was a time when the whole community recognized and admitted their personal sins and their sin as the people of God. Two goats were presented to the priests. Upon one goat they placed all the sins of the people and sent it out into the wilderness to take away their sins. This is where we come up with the term scapegoat. The other goat was presented as a burnt offering to God as a holy sacrifice, while the people of God recommitted their lives to His service.

We must remember that the babe of Bethlehem became the Christ of the Cross, who died for the sins of the world. It is only by grace through Christ Jesus that we may be faithful. It is a good idea to follow this Hebrew/Jewish tradition as we approach the New Year. We too need to admit our personal sins and our sin as the people of God. It is vitally important that we not use someone else as a scapegoat to avoid admitting our own sins personally and as a Church. If we are not willing to confess our sins then why make New Year's resolutions?

New Year's resolutions are simply stating something we know we ought to do anyway. It is a way of reminding ourselves of commitments we need to make, but fail to keep. Does anyone really take these New Year's resolutions seriously? Do we truly resolve in our hearts and minds to carrying them out?

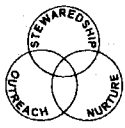
Certainly a resolution is less serious than a vow. Take a close look at how committed we are as a people to keeping our vows. We are a nation that consistently does not take seriously our wedding vows or the divorce rate in our country would be much lower. Do we really intend to be faithful to those vows, or do we enter into the marriage with an unspoken escape clause?

What about our Baptismal vows? Do we really "keep God's Holy will and commandments and walk in the same all the days of our lives?" Do we "faithfully participate in the ministries of the church by our prayers, our presence, our gifts, and our service, that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ?"

Consider the number of times we have renewed those vows each time someone is baptized or united with our church. Maybe we need to make sure we are being faithful to the vows we have already made in our lives before we move on to New Year's resolutions. So I ask, "Why make New Year's Resolutions?"

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

"EASY CHOCOLATE LOVER'S CHEESEPIE"

3 packages 8 oz. each Cream Cheese, softened	3/4 cup Sugar
2 cups 12 oz package Hershey's Mini Chips Semi-Chocolate, divided	3 Eggs
1 9 oz extra-serving-size packaged Graham Cracker Crumb Crust	1 tsp Vanilla Extract
	2 Tbsp Whipping Cream

Heat oven to 450 degrees. Beat cream cheese & sugar in large bowl with mixer until well blended. Add eggs & vanilla; beat well. Stir in 1 2/3 cups small chocolate chips; pour into crust. Bake 10 minutes. Without opening oven door, reduce temperature to 250 degrees; continue baking 30 minutes or just until set. Remove from oven to wire rack. Cool completely. Cover; refrigerate until thoroughly chilled. Place remaining 1/3 cup chips and whipping cream in small microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on HIGH (100%) 20 to 30 seconds or just until chips are melted and mixture is smooth when stirred. Cool slightly; spread over top of cheesepie. Refrigerate 15 minutes or until topping is set. Cover; refrigerate leftover cheesepie.
